Enchanting garden pathways that are free to stroll each day from dawn to dusk. Find the biggest blooms during April and May.

- LINCOLN CITY COMMUNITY CENTER**
Perfect for rainy days, the LCCC features an indoor track, climbing wall, fitness center, pool, and so much more.

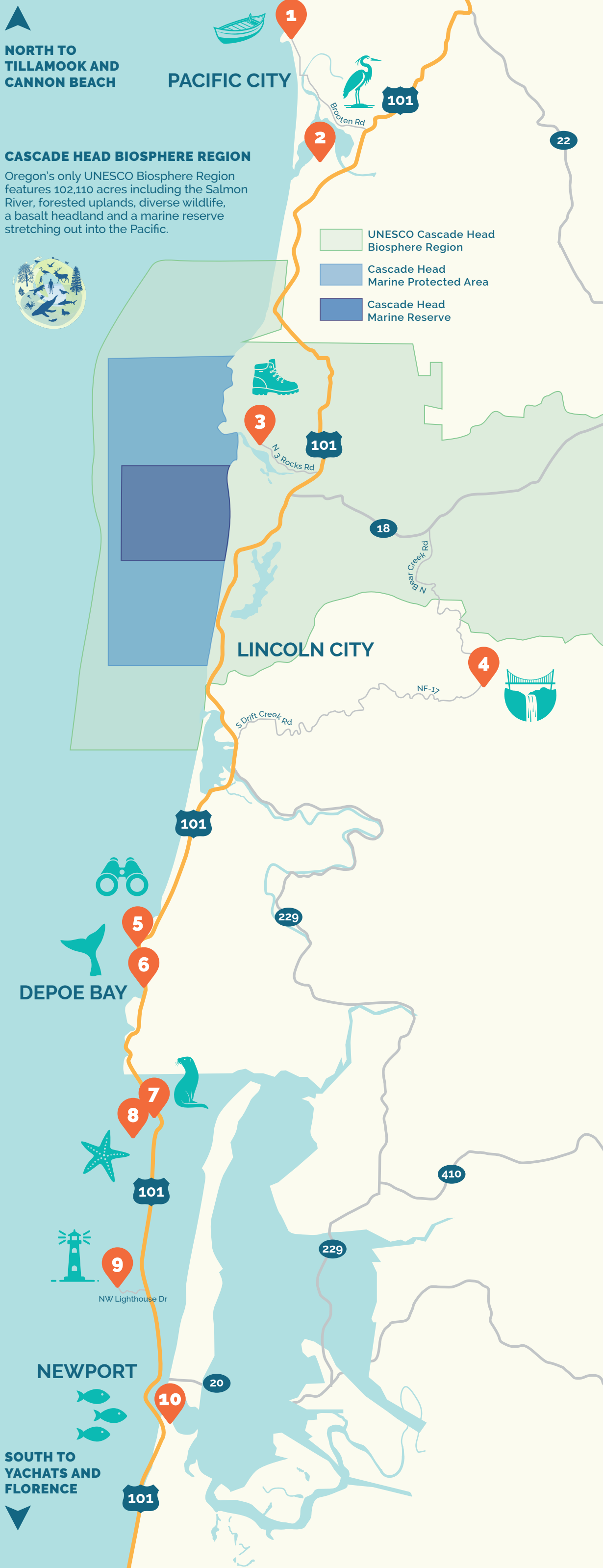

REGIONAL MAP

- CAPE KIWANDA STATE NATURAL AREA**
Part of the Three Capes Scenic Route, this steep dune climb yields an amazing view of the ocean's powerful tide, extraordinary dory boat ocean launches, and community beach activities.
30000 CAPE KIWANDA DRIVE, PACIFIC CITY
- NESTUCCA BAY NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE**
Reconnect with nature as you hike the beautiful trails on lands dedicated to protecting wildlife habitat, while taking in the amazing, panoramic ocean views.
7000 CHRISTIANSEN ROAD, CLOVERDALE
- LOWER CASCADE HEAD TRAIL**
The Lower Cascade Head Trail begins at Knight Park and winds through a lush coastal forest before revealing a coastal prairie with panoramic ocean views. This moderately challenging, year-round hike offers a stunning glimpse into one of the Oregon Coast's most diverse ecosystems. Pets are not allowed on the trail, as it passes through a protected wildlife sanctuary.
THREE ROCKS ROAD TO KNIGHT PARK
- DRIFT CREEK FALLS TRAIL**
A nearly four-mile journey through old-growth forest, traversing a 240-foot long suspension bridge arriving at the stunning 75 foot waterfall.
FOREST SERVICE ROAD 17, OTIS
- BOILER BAY STATE SCENIC VIEWPOINT**
The basalt-rimmed bay offers panoramic views featuring whales, ocean-going birds and, at low tide, a glimpse of the J Marhofer's ship wreckage from 1910.
- DEPOE BAY WHALE WATCHING CENTER**
Park rangers at this educational center provide opportunities to view whales and other marine life while simultaneously sharing facts about feeding, migrating and unique swimming patterns.
119 SW HWY. 101, DEPOE BAY
- OTTER ROCK**
Visit this small, unincorporated community south of Depoe Bay where, just offshore, Oregon's smallest marine reserve, at 1.2 square miles, can be found.
6546 "A" AVENUE, OTTER ROCK
- DEVILS PUNCHBOWL STATE NATURAL AREA**
Enjoy vibrant marine life while listening to the roaring ocean fill this hollow rock formation, then make your way to a picnic beside the nearby tidepools.
122 1ST STREET, OTTER ROCK
- YAQUINA HEAD LIGHTHOUSE**
Since 1872, this 93-foot tower has stood watch over crashing waves, thousands of seabirds, extensive tidepools, and those elusive whales.
750 NW LIGHTHOUSE DRIVE, NEWPORT
- OREGON COAST AQUARIUM**
Expand your coastal knowledge through exhibits and unique sea life encounters. Learn how the aquarium promotes conservation and animal protection through its critical work.
